

MA IN THRACE AND THE CULTURE OF ANCIENT WORLD (TAUGHT IN BULGARIAN)

Brief presentation of the program: The program provides in-depth knowledge of the genesis and development of culture in Thrace and in II-I millennium BC. , emphasis on the comparative analysis between the processes in Thrace and processes in the rest of the ancient world. After graduation, you will be able to conduct independent scientific and archeological research (and goes, excavation, material handling, etc.). During your study you will mastered the skills to expert analysis of the works of Thracian art (style features and technological characteristics of the metal processing, dating of archaeological artifacts). Furthermore, the training program requires building skills for reporting and compiling a bibliography, critical analysis of scientific literature on Thracian culture, writing scientific text on the problems of the Thracian culture - self-examination in this problem area, teaching (preparation of lecture and thematic justification of course).
